

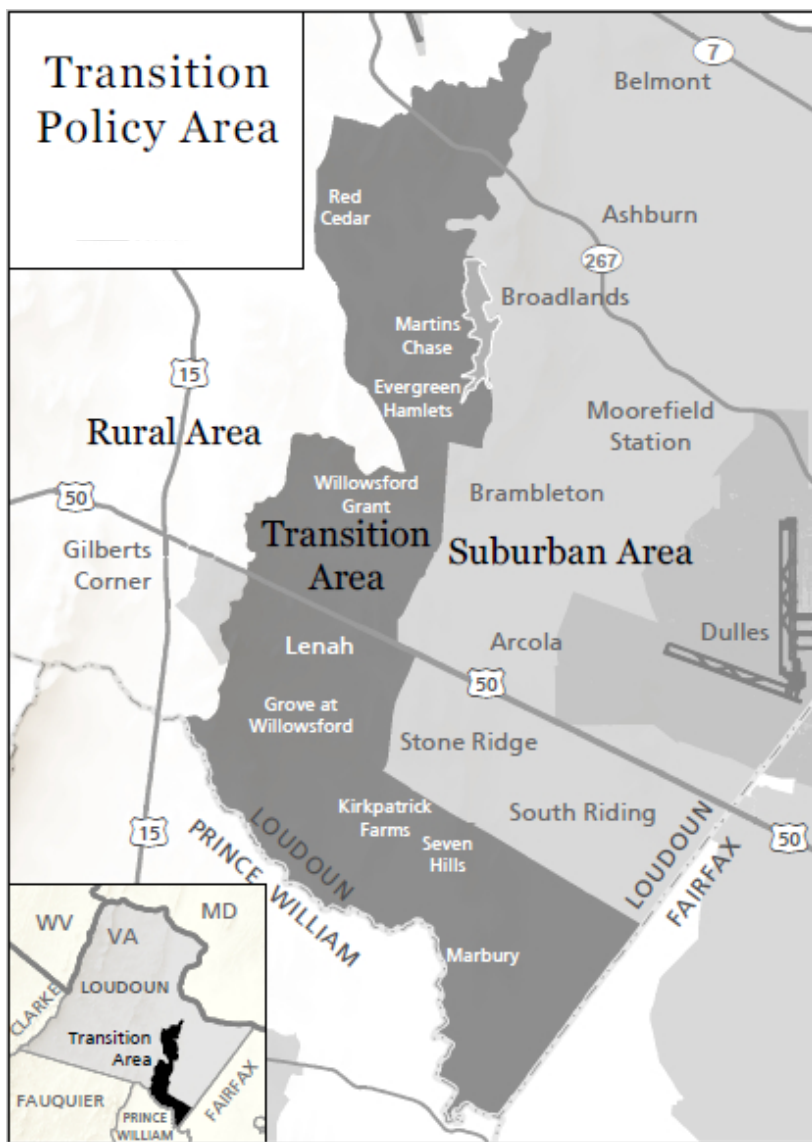

The Transition Policy Area (TPA) is a valuable resource in Loudoun County that provides opportunities for outdoor recreation, wildlife and environmental protection, and preservation of cultural and historical sites. A more densely developed TPA will endanger critical drinking water resources, historical sites, and open spaces that make it unique. If the TPA is opened to suburban development, there will be no buffer, or "Gateway," protecting the Rural Area.



The Loudoun County Board of Supervisors is developing a new Comprehensive Plan to guide land use and development through the *Envision Loudoun* initiative (www.envision-loudoun.org)

- **Public input is critical.** Make your opinions known by attending the Envision Loudoun public input meetings (see schedule of June meetings on reverse).
- **Preserve open space.** The TPA protects natural, cultural, historic and environmental resources that are the reason many people moved to Loudoun County.
- **Reduce or retain current TPA density.** Excessive development leads to more traffic, congested schools, higher taxes and lower property values.
- **Sustainable development.** The TPA can be a national model for recreational areas, parks, trails, and bike paths, while protecting wildlife biodiversity, and drinking water sources.

The Transition Policy Area (TPA) is an area of the County with lower residential density designed to form a transition from the high density Suburban Policy Area (eastern Loudoun) to the pastoral Rural Policy Area (western Loudoun).
